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Chapter 1: Motivation

Why did I start volunteering in Tanzania?

I ended up in Tanzania in a detour. It started with a tour of Sri Lanka with my family. The trip was organized by people who are very active in that country with their private foundation and they took us to their volunteer projects. Thanks to the volunteers, many children were able to receive an education and learn to earn a living. There I saw with my own eyes how these private initiatives have made a difference for many families and children in recent years. This experience left a deep impression on me.

How did I come up with the idea for this project?

I looked on the internet for an organization that deals with these types of activities. My preference was for Africa because I had simply never been there before. At one point I came across a social project in Arusha, Tanzania. I went there as a volunteer, lived with a family and helped at a primary school. During this period I got to know the Tanzanian culture up close. What an incredibly impressive experience that was! When I met Ronald Mtui, I started looking with him to find out exactly what there was a need for and what I could contribute to with my work and life experience. Ronald soon discovered that the Ashari primary school needed someone who was familiar with computers. Children with computer knowledge have an advantage in Tanzania's tight labor market.

Chapter 2: Founding and objectives

Based on the foregoing, the All for the future foundation was established on August 4, 2022 and has the following objectives:

- Providing help and support in social, financial and material areas;
- offering children and young adults an opportunity to receive education;
- support schools financially and materially to give students the opportunity to develop for the future;
- and furthermore everything that is directly or indirectly related to this or can be conducive to this, everything in the broadest sense of the word.

The board members, members of the recommendation committee and committee members all have an unpaid position within the foundation. The efforts are made in your own time. Travel and accommodation costs for the implementation and on-site inspection of the projects are for your own account and are not derived from the donations. A cash audit takes place annually.



The foundation has chosen to implement the above objectives in the Moshi - Himo region in Tanzania.

Chapter 4: Cooperation

As already indicated in the introduction, the foundation does not have exact knowledge of the location mentioned and therefore collaboration with local partners is essential. Important key figures for this collaboration include:

- Mrs. Overa Sahlberg, chairman of the Mokicco Foundation
- Mrs. Rohda Shao: shop owner and volunteer who works for children and young adults
- Mr Ronald Mtui: Safari guide and supports, advises and supervises the projects
- Mr Victor Kisuma: ICT specialist at a hospital and as ICT specialist he supports the computer lab of the Ashari Primary school
- Mrs. Nassary: Head of School Ashira Prmary School

Chapter 5: Ambition

The ambition of the foundation is to work closely with local volunteers / organizations because they know where the need is greatest. This can involve both small and larger investments. Not only in people but also in materials. Within a few years, the foundation wants to visit a number of schools in the Moshi and Himo area and support them with educational facilities.

Chapter 6: Vision and mission

The vision and mission of the foundation is to structurally support the learning environment of young people. The foundation focuses on the places Moshi and Himo, which are located at the foot of Kilimanjaro in Northern Tanzania. The foundation does not provide short-term development aid, but we prefer to invest in sustainable cooperation with local volunteers and school boards in the long term. This local collaboration guarantees the sustainability of our projects.

Chapter 7: Projects

In order to realize the above ambitions/objectives, the foundation chooses to develop a number of projects each year, which are detailed in a work plan.



All for the future support the needs Financial resources will also be linked to these projects so that a concrete overview can be presented annually of the projects / goals, their realization and the financial resources available for them.

Chapter 8: Finance

To realize the projects mentioned, financial resources are of course required and this will be done through sponsorship. It should be noted that sponsors prefer a specific project (earmarked resources) or in a general sense, whereby the board can then apply an allocation itself.

Chapter 10: The Roadmap

- 1. One of the board members travels to the Moshi-Himo area once a year to personally examine the state of affairs.
- 2. The board has contact with the local contact persons every two weeks to discuss the progress of the projects and to identify any new needs.



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 3. Twice a year, donors and interested parties are kept informed of the progress of the projects and the activities of the foundation. This takes place via email and social media.
- 4. An annual recruitment campaign is held among (potential) donors, with the target amount being €5,000.00.

Note: All payments required per project are made personally by the foundation. The foundation is transparent so that there is no doubt or ambiguity about the expenditure of the finances.

Chapter 11: Length and validity period
